Auman Museum of Radio & Television

Travel back in time and view a collection of radios from the 1920's as well as rare TVs from the 1930's and 40's. On display are advertising, comic books, and photographs related to the early days of television and radio.

John's Vintage Vacuum Museum

A collection of cleaners from the early years (1800s) of pump style pneumatic vacs to the late 90s when Hoover was still located in North Canton, Ohio. The collection covers not only the cleaners themselves but the production, advertising, repair and related items. The 30s covers the advertising and addition of the motor for electric operation. The 40s and 50s shows the progress to more advanced collection methods including paper bags and styling to aid in marketing sales. The 60s shows the addition of the colors and technology capitalizing on the space exploration era and the direct marketing to women. The more current models show the end of the Hoover company in Ohio and features the technology of the time at Hoover's height of success.

The Ernest Warther Museum & Gardens



64 hand carved masterpieces await your visit to the home of the World's Master Carver, Ernest "Mooney" Warther. Warther created perfect scale working replicas of steam engines including a recreation of the Lincoln Funeral Train. These works of art, crafted from ebony, ivory, and walnut, will surely amaze visitors. While at the museum, enjoy the quaint charm of the family home as well as Frieda Warther's Swiss-styled flower gardens and her button collection featuring over 73,000 pieces arranged in beautiful patterns.
