While exploring two floors of vintage Coleman products, visitors will discover lanterns from all over the world. Vintage kitchen cook stoves and Kero heating stoves along with a Coleman mini-bike and snowmobile and the nostalgic camping items such as camp stoves, ice chests, and water jugs will be sure to intrigue. Items including a 1900 Model 316 Arc Lantern, Olympic torches from the 2002 Salt Lake City games, and a 1/8 scale railroad flat car are just a few of the treasures on display.

Reeves Victorian Home and Carriage House Museum

Listed on the National Registry of Historic Places and home to Dover industrialist and banker Jeremiah E. Reeves, this 19th century mansion will be sure to delight guests with beautifully restored rooms and original Reeves family furnishings. The Carriage House features the Reeves family sleigh and 1892 hansom carriage along with a Rauch and Lang electric car, orchestral Regina music box, and restored doctor's buggy.

John's Vintage Vacuum Museum

A collection of cleaners from the early years (1800s) of pump style pneumatic vacs to the late 90s when Hoover was still located in North Canton, Ohio. The collection covers not only the cleaners themselves but the production, advertising, repair and related items. The 30s covers the advertising and addition of the motor for electric operation. The 40s and 50s shows the progress to more advanced collection methods including paper bags and styling to aid in marketing sales. The 60s shows the addition of the colors and technology capitalizing on the space exploration era and the direct marketing to women. The more current models show the end of the Hoover company in Ohio and features the technology of the time at Hoover's height of success.

Olde Main Street Museum/Temperance Tavern

Cy Young and Woody Hayes displays are an added delight for sports fans. End the day with a performance of "The Many Faces of Old Glory" by Vane Scott.
